



POLICY: COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS

50 Dangerous Things... Camp considers health and safety to be of utmost importance. We comply with The Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and the Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1992 at all times. 50DT camp has appropriate insurance cover, including public liability insurance.

THIS POLICY IS IN ADDITION TO AND SHOULD BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY (2020) AND THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF BOOKING (2020).

50 Dangerous Things Camp will take place in very different circumstances during Summer 2020. As such, it has been necessary to change the way we manage the camp, and how we use the site, in order to make it possible to run at all. Please take the time to read this document, so that you understand how we plan to keep your children, and ourselves, as safe as possible with respect to Covid-19 Coronavirus.

Please note: we continue to risk assess 50DT ACTIVITIES on the basis of "as safe as necessary".

1. The **same members of staff will be on duty** every day during the 6 days 50DT will operate over Summer 2020.
2. The three 'core' members of staff will each care for a **'Bubble' of no more than 8 children**.
3. Each **Bubble will be maintained** over the course of each day and over the course of each 3 day 'session' period.
4. **Bubbles will not mix** with one another but instead will 'occupy' a discrete part of the site for a period of time, on a rotating basis. All children will continue to access all activities and spaces over the course of the 3-day session.
5. We will do our best to enable **friends** to be in the same Bubble; all **siblings** will be in a Bubble together.
6. The site will have **three 'Hubs'**: the wildlife area and pond; the lower Infant field' and the main Infant school playground.
7. **Each Bubble will be assigned its own Hub** for the entirety of the 3-day session, where children's belongings, including packed lunches, can be stored. There will be no access to the rear lobby other than for accessing the toilets or any part of the school building other than for H&S purposes (e.g. first aid, emergencies)
8. **Start times will be staggered** to minimise congestion, and morning sign in will be at the child's assigned Hub and with their Hub leader.
9. **Pick up times will also be staggered** to minimise congestion, with sign out taking place from the Wildlife Area gate.
10. There will be **no off-site trips** this summer.
11. **Handwashing facilities and hand sanitisers** will be available at each Hub and around the grounds. Children will be instructed and supported to wash hands frequently and always after participating in activities or before eating or drinking.

12. We will model and encourage good respiratory practice – **catch it, bin it, kill it.**
13. Please ensure your child has used the toilet before arriving in the morning. More detailed guidance around using the **toilet facilities** will be issued nearer the start of camp, but children will be expected to use the facilities one at a time, and toilet facilities will be cleaned at least twice each day, prior to our snack and lunch times.
14. Key **touch points will be cleansed** during the day – e.g. handrails, gate latches, doorways.
15. Where possible, Bubbles will have their own **tools and equipment** (e.g. drills, whittlers, den kit) and where this isn't possible, tools and equipment will be cleaned with sanitising wipes or soap and water, before use by the next Bubble.
16. Details of children attending and parents / carers dropping off and collecting children will be kept for 21 after the final Summer 2020 session and shared with the government's **Test and Trace** programme if requested.

This policy is subject to change and will be amended as necessary if Government guidelines change.
